NRIS Advisory Committee Action: The NRIS Advisory Committee agrees to implement 90-15-201 MCA, Duties of the Committee, as follows:

Natural Resource Information System - Duties of the NRIS Advisory Committee NRIS Advisory Committee Discussion Document March 13, 2002

In order to enable the Committee to effectively carry out the duties outlined above, the Committee recommends that persons selected to represent member agencies should possess the following characteristics:

- Understands the information needs of their respective agencies and can communicate those needs to NRIS;
- Understands the role of NRIS in providing services that address agency needs and can explain NRIS' role to their respective agencies;
- Has the authority to speak for their agency on matters of concern to the Committee, particularly with respect to strategic planning, policy and fiscal matters;
- Can speak for their agency to the Governor's office and to the legislature, or has the ability to communicate directly to those in their agency who do so; and.
- Understands and can communicate the overall role of NRIS as it relates to the role of other state agencies; the university system and the Department of Administration regarding the functions, duties and issues of concern to NRIS.
