# Search MSL, NRIS, Heritage, and Montana State Government Using Google®

Jon Nehring, from the State Library, has figured out an extremely clever way to use Google to search MLN, MSL, NRIS, Heritage, and some or all of Montana State Government's web sites. It only searches web pages; it does not search web-based library catalogs or the web-based Gale/InfoTrac databases Mike mounted this new search window in the lower left-hand corner of the Montana Library Network homepage: <a href="http://montanalibraries.org/">http://montanalibraries.org/</a>

Select the part of the hierarchy you want to search, type in your search terms, and click on "Google Search". It works amazingly well. You can read more about this feature of Google on Google: <a href="http://www.google.com/help/refinesearch.html#domain">http://www.google.com/help/refinesearch.html#domain</a>, and apply this tactic to other web-spaces besides MSL's or the State's.

#### Montana Library Association Annual Meeting Report


The MLA Annual Meeting was a busy and successful one for MLN staff. Working with John Finn and Kathy Mora, Mike Price and I set up the portable laptop lab. The Have-Laptop-Will-Travel lab worked flawlessly for the entire time, and was used by workshops as well as Montana librarians eager to keep current with their e-mail. Other MLN related MLA presentations included:

- Mike, Lisa Mecklenberg Jackson, Rick Branham (from Sirsi), and Bruce presented
  the same workshop twice to over a hundred librarians: "Technology "Gadgets" That
  Will Send Your Library Sky High!" (We demonstrated an Internet-based white
  board, Ariel (an Internet fax equivalent for libraries), video conferencing over
  NetMeeting, iBistro, and wireless tools for inventory);
- Bruce played a minor role in Lisa's "Learning Ready Reference Skills With Elvis";
- Bruce also presented a workshop overview of "MLN Gateway"; and spoke at the

Interlibrary Loan Interest Group meeting.

## OCLC WorldCat Usage

Montana's use of OCLC's giant WorldCat reference database is about it was the previous two months. We haven't had to turn any searchers away, and Montana libraries conducted a near record 5,167 searches.



#### Future Plans—Montana Shared Catalog (MSC)

We're in the process of implementing the MSC for the first seventeen libraries; we're still on target to 'go live' the first of August. Training has begun (thank you Missoula Public Library; thank you also Mansfield Library and Clinton School) and more training is on the way. A MSC Member's Council meeting, scheduled for May 29 in Missoula, promises to include discussion of a variety of topics; not the least of which is future costs and cost-sharing formulas, cataloging practices, and training.

Start-up costs for the MSC come from federal Library Service and Technology Act (LSTA) funds, as well as from participating libraries. LSTA funds become available in the early part of each calendar year. Until LSTA funds are allocated to Montana, and until the State Library Commission sets budgets and apportions these moneys between a number of programs and projects, we don't know how much will be available for MLN and the MSC. However...

Just in case you were wondering: the State Library's Long Range Plan <a href="http://msl.state.mt.us/admin/lrplan/lrp.html">http://msl.state.mt.us/admin/lrplan/lrp.html</a> includes ongoing support of the MSC. So, although we don't know how much money we'll have for it next year (or the next, or the next...) rest assured that our plan (literally) is to keep on supporting the growth of the MSC.

and shared catalogs until everyone who wants to be part of a shared catalog has had the opportunity.

Next year, that is, July 2002 through June 2003, we're hopeful that a number of southeastern Montana libraries will join the MSC. In May, Suzanne Reymer and Bruce Newell toured portions of Sagebrush and South Central library federations. There is a lot of enthusiasm for this project—we're all hoping for the financial wherewithal to transform this enthusiasm into better library tools for library staff and patrons.

Please Complete the Online Information Source Survey (reprinted from previous issue) Should more funding become available, the Networking Task Force is considering which additional online information sources to add to the Montana State Library's (MSL's) statewide purchase agreement (such as the current subscription to InfoTrac).

MSL plans to continue to coordinate the purchase of a general-purpose magazine index, such as InfoTrac, UMI's Proquest product, or EbscoHost. The subscription for Gale's InfoTrac magazine database ends in August 2003, and MSL will release a Request for Proposal (RFP) to seek proposals in the spring of 2003. Members of the Networking Task Force, and other interested individuals will evaluate the proposals.

If we do add an additional database or databases, the selection will have something for everyone. This survey is intended to seek your advice on these selections. We're asking for your suggestions by subject rather than for specific databases. Examples illustrate the subject area, and are not intended to express preference for a specific product. Academic, public, school, and special libraries should all find resources useful to them in the mix of online information resources selected.

#### OCLC Enrollment—Update

June 14 is the deadline for enrolling in the MLN/OCLC statewide contract for next year, July 2002 through June 2003. As of May 22, we're about \$150,000 short of our statewide contractual obligation to OCLC. If your library intends to enroll, but has not yet done so, please consider doing so today.

The Networking Task Force has devised a new shared-cost formula for copy-cataloging libraries, based on a size-indexed base-rate and CatExpress transactions. Ours is a unique cooperative venture; no other group of libraries in the world works together in Montana's fashion to purchase OCLC services. By working together Montana libraries make it possible for most if not all Montana libraries to make use of OCLC's copycataloging and interlibrary loan tools. As a state our contract saves us over \$600,000 a year,
