

New Montanaiana—*Montana Authors: A Bio-bibliography.* Karen A Hatcher and Katherine Schaefer, 1985



As of July 2002 this online resource is made temporarily available in a non-MARC text format. Sometime during the fall of 2002, richer records on the MLN Gateway (http://http://161.7.8.17:8000/) will replace this temporary file and enable it to be searched simultaneously with other Montanaiana online information resources. This present version is a considerably condensed version of Hatcher and Schaefer's work, originally published by the University of Montana in 1985. Many thanks to Karen Hatcher and the Mansfield Library at the University of Montana for their generosity and participation in this project. This is an important information resource for Montanans and those interested in Montana or literary-Montana.

These files contain 11,200 entries represents Montana approximately 400 authors and their work. Citations are drawn from the nineteenth and twentieth century, up to the mid-1980's. To be included Montana authors must have been born in Montana or lived here for at least five years. Editors, compilers, illustrators, etc. have not been included. The sources of data include about twenty-five standard sources, such as *Contemporary Authors, Who's Who in America*, or *Who's Who in Pacific Northwest Authors*.

2003 OCLC Contract

212 Montana libraries have enrolled in the statewide MLN/OCLC contract for fiscal year 2003 (July 2002—June 2003). We raised enough funds to meet our contractual obligation to OCLC.

Training is being scheduled for September and October; we'll post details as they are finalized. We're anticipating classes in western and eastern Montana, perhaps Missoula and Billings. Classes will include:

- CatExpress copy-cataloging
- Web-based OCLC Interlibrary Loan
- Cataloging (including OCLC's new *Connexion* interface for libraries doing original cataloging on OCLC; for more information see http://www.oclc.org/connexion/)

Montana Shared Catalog Comes Online August 12

The 'go-live' date for the Montana Shared Catalog is the week of August 12. Our original target was the week of July 28; this date proved to be overly ambitious. Training will be completed July 26 and the patron and gap-bibliographic files will be in place by August 12. The MSC will be available for searching over the Web with Sirsi's iBistro (or iLink) interface. This 'Amazon-like' graphical catalog interface will allow patrons to view book covers, tables of contents, reviews, and best-seller lists. You can see Wyoming's implementation of Sirsi's iBistro interface called 'WYLDCat', serving over 70 libraries at: http://wyld.state.wy.us/.

The MSC catalog will contain the holdings of seventeen libraries. It will contain approximately 400,000 unique bibliographic records and over 600,000 items. For more information about the Montana Shared Catalog, see: <u>http://montanalibraries.org/MLNmschome.htm</u>

Subject to the availability of federal Library Service and Technology Act funds, preliminary plans call for beginning to add these libraries to the MSC during January 2003, and bringing these SE Montana libraries online in June 2003. I anticipate that several other non-SE Montana libraries may join the MSC, using exclusively local funds, at the same time.
