Montana Talking Books Library

TBL Goal 1: To ensure that all eligible clients know about the availability of services from MTBL and to make enrollment and use of the service easy for users.

Developed a statistical format to track the application and enrollment process.

Presentation of MTBL service was made to twenty-two members of the Blind and Low Vision Support Group in Laurel in July.

A grant from Northwestern Energy to supply 125 Talking Book Markers to patrons was received. The manufacturer, Jim Daily, donated over half (in-kind) to match the grant.

Equipment for schools were checked and mailed out.

Devoloped a system to better process new equipment going to patrons.

TBL Goal 2: MTBL will plan and implement a smooth transition to a digital format to ensure that the potential for expanded services are available to MTBL patrons.

Helena Recording studio closed from April through August in preparation for digital installation. This included:

Two computer jacks in the Monitor and Review booths were installed.

Two Digital Training workshops for volunteers were conducted.

Evaluation and inventory of necessary studio space and equipment was completed.

TBL Goal 3: Allow service to the patrons to be provided more efficiently and effectively by providing enough space for the collection.

The Xcess process was completed in August. This involved processing over 5,733 audio books and containers for weeding out of our collection.

Audio books from the oldest part of our collection (RC6000-RC11398) were relocated downstairs, making room for new books and continued shifting and weeding of upstairs collection.

TBL Goal 4: Increase productivity and satisfaction of staff members and volunteers.

The National Library Service Consultant visited MTBL on August 6th & 7th, reviewing all services and answering staff and volunteer questions.

The new Coordinator of Volunteer and Recording Program was hired on July 8.
