## **BENEFIT/OUTCOME SUMMARY BY PROGRAM**

## **Program 1: Continuing Education/Annual Meeting**

#### Narrative:

This program supports Goals #1 and #2 of the Broad Valleys Federation

Annual Meeting – Members voted to continue meeting once a year for a two-day meeting, location of which is within the boundaries of the Federation. Retreat will include a minimum of two continuing education workshops.

Each library will receive \$37.50 to help defray travel costs to the meeting.

The Lewis & Clark Library will coordinate and pay for the costs of lodging, meals and continuing education presentations. As costs have risen and there is higher attendance at the retreat, the Federation approved an increase to cover retreat costs. The Lewis & Clark Library will receive up to \$5,000 to pay for this service.

Benefit/Outcome:

This is a popular, long-standing program of the Broad Valleys Federation, bringing Federation librarians and trustees together to discuss items of interest face-to-face. Once again concurrent workshop sessions were offered, a trustee track and a librarian track. Attendees earned continuing education credits through the Montana Library Certification Program. Five outstanding workshops were offered and included New Online Plan of Service Reporting Tools (Librarian Track); Legal Reference 101(Librarian Track); Cultivating Adult Programs (Librarian Track); Libraries and Collection Development Policies and Practices (Trustee Track); and Privacy Issues in Librariees (Trustee Track).

Federation libraries were represented at the retreat and this meeting, as well as the Montana State Prison, Whitehall School District, OPI, and the Montana State Library. Twenty-eight Federation librarians, twelve trustees, four State Library staffers and one representative from the State Library Commission (OPI) attended the retreat.

Each Federation library received a stipend of \$37.50 to be used to offset the cost of traveling to this meeting and all expenses were paid by the Federation. \$5,000 was budgeted for the retreat and \$3,712.25 was actually spent.

Unexpended Funds from the Broad Valleys Retreat held March 6-7, 2009 were repurposed. \$1,200 was moved to Program 2, Continuing Education and funded online courses through the University of North Texas LEAD Program. With these funds the Federation was able to purchase 120 class seats for Federation librarians and trustees. Courses are eligible for CE credits through the Montana Library Certification Program, helping librarians reach their certification goals. The LEAD classes have been an invaluable addition to the Continuing Education Program, both for librarians and trustees. Online courses provide additional professional development opportunities while saving money on travel and allowing librarians and trustees to take classes when convenient for them

The remaining balance of \$87.75 was used to purchase laminate supplies for Book Discussions in
a Bag which are processed by Lewis & Clark Library (Federation Coordinator). These kits are
available to all Montana libraries and the collection now boasts 101 titles

## **Program 2: Continuing Education Grants**

#### Narrative:

Each library will receive a direct grant of \$474.10 to be used to provide continuing education to librarians and trustees, at the discretion of each individual library.

Benefit/Outcome:

For many of our Federation libraries, funds provided through this program are the only budgeted source available to them for continuing education. In addition to the annual Montana Library Association Conference, librarians and trustees took advantage of a variety of training. Networking and staying abreast with new technologies and services is essential.

As noted under outcomes for Program One, the LEAD classes have been an invaluable addition to the Continuing Education Program, both for librarians and trustees. Online courses provide additional professional development opportunities while saving money on travel and allowing librarians and trustees to take classes when convenient for them

Accompanying individual library reports provide details of the breadth of continuing education opportunities.

## **Program 3: Technology**

#### Narrative:

Monies will be used for technology related expenses. Emphasis will be on technology that strengthens federation-wide access. Additional emphasis will be on federation wide resource sharing and document delivery. Monies received in this category will be expended for such things as hardware, software, OCLC expenditures, statewide database expenditures, virtual reference, and shared catalog expenses. \*\*Each member library may designate some or all of their technology funds for Federation wide purchase of Heritage Quest.

### Benefit/Outcome:

Broad Valley Federation libraries utilized funds that continued to strengthen Federation wide access as well as resource sharing and document delivery. Funds were used to cover or offset costs of OCLC, giving member libraries a means to share their library's collections and resources through OCLC's online ILL system; offset costs for the Montana Shared Catalog; cover or offset costs of the Heritage Quest genealogy database; subscribe to Overdrive (downloadable e-content provider) through the Statewide Project My Montana Library 2 Go; purchase computer hardware/software that are of vital importance to resource sharing and document delivery.

Accompanying individual library reports reflect how the needs of each member library were served through this program.

## **Program 4: Book Discussions in a Bag**

Narrative:

This program is originally a result of carry-over funds from FY2005 and now covers all less-than-anticipated expenditures for costs related to the Annual Meeting. The Books Discussion in a Bag program was established in March of 2006 and is now being utilized by the members of the Federation. Unexpended funds from the 2009 Annual Meeting may be used to purchase additional titles; Federation libraries submit their title suggestions and titles selected will be taken from this list.

#### Benefit/Outcome:

A portion of unexpended funds designated for the annual retreat was repurposed to Program 4, plus 4 cents in unexpended funds from Drummon. \$87.79 was used to purchase laminate supplies for Book Discussions in a Bag which are processed by Lewis & Clark Library (Federation Coordinator). Lewis & Clark Library is now supplementing this Program by cycling in titles from books used for the Library's five ongoing adult book discussion groups, as well as three teen book discussion groups. These kits are available to all Montana libraries and the collection now boasts 101 titles.

## **Program 5: Admnistrative Services**

#### Narrative:

Broad Valleys Federation of Libraries will provide to the Lewis & Clark Library a stipend of \$800, which will be used to defray the costs of coordination of the Federation activities

#### Benefit/Outcome:

Funds helped Federation Coordinator plan meeting agendas, set up meetings, complete the plan of service and annual report preparation and filing, consultation and follow-up with Federation libraries regarding Federation Plan of Service activities. Funds were used to offset costs of printing, materials needed for annual retreat, mailings, long distance costs, and other related administrative costs.

Dillon Public Library could not, on its own, provide anywhere near the catalog and online services that we receive by participating in MSC. The catalog connects us to all the many participating MSC libraries, allows us to participate in an area wide partners resource sharing group (MSC - 4 Rivers Group), and many Montana citizens benefit by having access to the services provided by MSC at their local or area library.

Twenty-eight Federation librarians, twelve trustees, four State Library staffers and one representative from the State Library Commission (OPI) attended the retreat.

#### FEDERATION EXECUTIVE MEETING

FY 2009 Federation Officers met to discuss Federation Board general meeting agenda. In attendance were Jodi Oberweiser, Lee Phillips, John Finn, Angela Giono, Hart noted that there would be unexpended funds remaining from the annual retreat budget. Several options for repurposing the unexpended funds were discussed and included designating funds for travel stipends, continuing education, toward purchase of Heritage Quest and Technology Program. As the Chair rotates between small, medium and large libraries, nominations for Vice-Chair represent a large library. The following nominations and appointments for FY2010 Officers were made:

**FY2009 PLAN OF SERVICE REVIEW** – Fiscal Year 2009 was reviewed. Hart noted that there would be about \$1000 remaining in the FY2009 budget for the retreat. Executive committee suggested dividing up the money across the programs in the plan of service or online course purchases for Federation members. Alice Meister moved to use the remaining funds to pay for online training opportunities; seconded by Milla Cummins. Motion carried

A letter of appreciation will be sent to Mike Price for helping with the online Federation reporting system.

**FY2010 PLAN OF SERVICE** – Hart noted that the \$800 the Lewis & Clark Library receives to cover administrative costs as the Federation Coordinator is sufficient. Funding remains the same as FY2009 with the Broad Valleys Federation scheduled to receive \$36,706.

**Program One - Continuing Education/Annual Meeting**: Discussion centered on continuing the two day retreat in spring and adding a fall online webinar. Milla Cummins moved to schedule the FY2010 annual retreat on Friday and Saturday, March 5-6, 2010; seconded by Alice Meister. Motion carried. Location for retreat is to be determined. It was agreed that the Executive Committee attempt to meet twice a year.

Lewis & Clark Library will receive \$5,000 to cover retreat costs. Each library will continue to receive a \$37.50 stipend for travel to retreat. Members discussed continuing education needs and were asked to submit suggestions for continuing education sessions for the next retreat. The Federation will continue to offer concurrent tracks, one geared to trustees, one to librarians.

**Program Two – Continuing Education Grants:** Each Federation library will receive \$474.10 to help offset costs for continuing education opportunities.

**Program Three – Technology:** Each Federation library will receive \$1,033.70 for this program. Funds can be applied to Heritage Quest. Milla Cummins moved to include Resource Sharing as part of the program title for technology

**Program Four – Book Discussions in a Bag:** Unexpended funds may be used to purchase additional titles. Funds designated for this program will be determined by the Federation at the annual spring retreat.

The Executive Committee suggested the FY2010 POS include a resource sharing clause that would address any unexpended funds and allow flexibility. Milla Cummins moved to include a resource sharing clause in the FY2010 POS; seconded by Lee Phillips. Motion carried. \*\*\*The following clause was added to the FY2010 POS under all programs:

Unexpended funds from any program may be redirected. Remaining funds may be used to secure additional continuing education /professional development opportunities, online databases, MontanaLibrary2Go, book discussion kits, or technology that benefits the Federation.

The FY 2010 POS will include a goal to increase attendance at the annual Federation retreat by 10%.
