4 Projects

- Montana Library 2 Go increased the collection budget for downloadable content
 - Project amount: \$96,573 General Fund
- Gigabit Toolkit purchase updated wifi routers for public libraries in the most need
 - Project amount: \$10,000 CARES Act
- Mobile hotspots purchase one year's worth of data and deploy hotspots to public libraries
 - Project amount: \$188,692 currently committed to June 2021, from General Fund, LSTA, and GEER funds
- READSquared purchase online reading app
 - Project amount: \$25,980 General Fund







Some stats and stories – Mobile Hotspots



- Number of hotspots deployed
 - 375 hotspots
 - 63 libraries (mostly public) are participating
 - Usage stats more than doubled from June to July

Some stats and stories - READsquared

- "We have had a very positive response to the virtual summer reading program. Parents find it much easier to keep track of their children's reading time and having missions and escape rooms have really kept the kids engaged. I was a bit skeptical about a virtual summer program, but it seems to be working out well. We are thinking about doing the 1,000 books before kindergarten using this program. A big thanks to both Amelea and the State Library for helping us get through these unusual times!"

What we have learned....

- MontanaLibrary2Go
 - Regular assessment helps us determine how to best serve our users
 - As behavior changes, libraries may wish to look at their collection development budgets holistically
 - As services change, there will be a need to communicate the value of these remote or nontraditional services to stakeholders
- Gigabit Toolkit
 - Improving Internet access is very individual and local to the library

What we have learned (cont)....

- Mobile hotspots
 - There is a need for device lending
 - We have identified how to streamline the process to make it more efficient and effective
 - Libraries need more help with implementation
- READsquared
 - Providing more time/support next summer will help with customization and usage
 - Encouraging 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten participation
 - Brainstorming more ways to reach out to community members and get people to try the program
