



Library Structure and Funding – October 7, 2025

Summary

Purpose of the Webinar

- This session focused on the **Library Structure and Financing** section, which had not been widely adopted by libraries.
- Tracy sought feedback on whether the roadmap goals were too ambitious or needed updating.

★ Key Themes & Takeaways

1. Stable Funding & Governance Structures

- Libraries need stable funding and solid governance to provide consistent services.
- The roadmap encourages:
 - Exploring independent library districts.
 - o Collaborative advocacy for funding.
 - Leveraging local revenue through partnerships.
 - Using local tax revenue (e.g., mill levies) for stability.

2. Feedback from Participants

- Many libraries rely on:
 - Friends groups and foundations.
 - Mill levies (some are planning new ones).
 - Fundraising (e.g., dinner theaters).
- Challenges include:
 - o Inactive Friends groups.
 - Limited local government support.
 - Outdated or ineffective MOUs and interlocal agreements.

3. MOUs vs. Interlocal Agreements

- MOUs (Memoranda of Understanding):
 - Useful for clarifying responsibilities (e.g., maintenance, HR).



Library Structure and Funding – October 7, 2025

- Not legally binding like laws; may not be enforced.
- Should be reviewed regularly.

Interlocal Agreements:

- Legally binding between government entities.
- Used to create or define library governance structures.
- Must follow Montana Code Annotated (Title 7).

4. Governance Models

• Independent Library Districts:

- Offer autonomy and stable funding.
- Board members are elected.
- Require significant effort to establish.

Multi-Jurisdictional Service Districts:

- Blend autonomy with shared services (e.g., HR, accounting).
- Can align with school or conservation district boundaries.

5. Legal and Strategic Advice

- Legal review is recommended when drafting MOUs or interlocal agreements.
- Use building inspections to document facility needs for funding discussions.
- Consider shared funding models for building maintenance.

- 6. How does your library plan for large capital expenses like roof repairs or technology upgrades? Have you considered a depreciation reserve fund?
- 7. What strategies have worked well for fundraising in your library or others you know? Are there low-effort, high-impact ideas worth trying?
- 8. What additional resources or training would help your library board and staff better understand governance and funding options?
