RESOLUTION 14-98 Verification of Establishment of the Thompson-Hickman County Library

WHEREAS, the following actions took place in 1922 in establishing a free county library:

WHEREAS, On May 18, 1922, William Boyce Thompson and his Attorney, E.B. Howell composed a letter to the County Commissioners stating his wish to tender to Madison County the gift of the Thompson-Hickman Memorial Library, recently built at Virginia City, as a County Free Library under the Laws of Montana (Secs. 4563-4573 Codes 1921). The gift included the beautiful stone two-story building with ample shelving in the upper story and a large room designed for the Madison County Museum in the lower story and the ground surrounding it. The gift also included furniture and books for the library, and display cases and other necessary furniture for the museum. Col. Thompson's purpose being to start with a fully equipped plant. The money value of this gift at the time is in excess of \$50,000. The above letter is attached as Addendum "A".

WHEREAS, no conditions were attached to the gift other than that Madison County shall take and use this property for the benefit of all the people of the County, and that it shall revert to Col. Thompson, or his heirs, in case the property is abandoned of ceases to be used as a library. The above letter is attached as Addendum "A".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of August 8, 1922, a petition for the establishment of a Free County Library was filed and a public hearing was set for September 2, 1922, at 2:00 PM. A copy of the Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "B".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of September 2, 1922, a public meeting was held and taken under advisement until the regular September meeting of the Board. A copy of Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "C".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of September 6, 1922, the Board agreed to accept the proposed gift for the library buildings, grounds, books, and other equipment when the property deed is presented to the Board. A copy of Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "D".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of March 7, 1923, the Board accepted the deed conveying the library

buildings, grounds, etc. to Madison County. A copy of the Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "E".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of April 3, 1923, a Library Fund was established. A copy of the Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "F".

WHEREAS, according to Commissioners' Journal of August 7, 1923, rules for the County Library were approved and adopted. A copy of Commissioners' Journal is attached as Addendum "G".

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the above information and addendum's verify that a free county library was established in Virginia City, Madison County, Montana, in 1922.

- 1. Books may be kept two weeks and may be renewed once for the same period.
- 2. A fine of two cents a day will be charged on each book kept overtime. No book will be issued to a person with a fine unpaid.
- 3. Each borrower is responsible for all injuries to books beyond reasonable wear, and for the value of books lost or destroyed.
- 4. A branch or deposit station may be established in any community where the Librarian is assured that some responsible person will take charge of the books.
 - 5. Individuals may send for books at any time.
- 6. People living at some distance from any branch will be allowed additional time to return books.
 - 7. People may have three books on a card, provided only one is fiction.
- 8. Any resident of Madison County shall be entitled to draw books from the Library free of charge after signing the proper application and agreement.
- 9. The library will be open every day in the week from 2 to 5 o'clock in the afternoon and from 7 to 9 o'clock in the evening. i.
