WHEREAS; the Montana State Library has requested documentation to verify that the Darby Public Library is indeed a legally established public library, and

WHEREAS; the legal documentation verifying of the original creation of the Library as the Darby Public Library could not be located, and

WHEREAS; documentation of the Darby Public Library being operational since June 6, 1956 has been found in the minutes of the Town Council meetings, and

WHEREAS; the Darby community and the Town Council recognizes the Darby Public Library as a public library, and

WHEREAS; this resolution will be incorporated into the minutes of a meeting of the Darby Town Council.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town Council of the Town of Darby hereby establishes the Darby Public Library as a free public library under the authority of Montana Code Annotated 22-1-303, subsection 1.

A Resolution of The Darby Community Public Library Board to Dissolve the Darby Public Library Board and seat the Darby Community Public Library Board of Trustees

Whereas; a proposal to form a Darby Community Public Library District was placed on the ballot in November 1998, for voter approval, and

Whereas; the voters have approved the proposal, and

Whereas; the Town of Darby and the Ravalli County Commissioners have signed an Interlocal Agreement, that defines the boundaries of the district, appointment of board members, term and salaries of board members, powers of the board, financing of the library, ownership and disposition of property, duration, and conditions of being effective, and

Whereas; as stated in the Interlocal Agreement two Library Board members shall be appointed by the County Commissioners, one for a term of two years and the other for a term of three years. Two members shall be appointed by the Town Council, one for a term of one year and the other for a term of four years, with one being a Town resident and the other a resident of the 'district'. The fifth board member shall be appointed jointly by the Commissioners and the Town Council for a term of five years. Upon the termination of the original appointments to the board, each term shall be for a duration of five years, by the body of government that originally appointed the position, and • Whereas; Forest Hayes, Mayor of Darby, recommended that the former board of the Darby Public Library be appointed as board members of the Darby Community Public Library District, and

Whereas; the County Commissioners appointed Martha Hayes for a term of two years, Palma Morrison for a term of three years, and approved jointly appointing Veryl Kosteczko for a term of five years.

Whereas; that the Town Council appoint the following persons to the Board of Trustees, of the Darby Community Public Library. Veryl Kosteczko shall be appointed jointly with the Commissioners for the term of five years, Lowell Baltz shall be appointed for a term of four years, and Peggy Smith shall be appointed for a term of one year.

Now Therefore It Be Resolved; The Darby Public Library Board of Trustees be dissolved and its members dismissed from their duties with gratitude and appreciation.

And Now Therefore Be It Further Resolved; The new Darby Community Library Board of Trustees be established and its members seated in accordance with the prescribed methods stated in the above outline procedures.

INTERLOCAL LIBRARY CONTRACT

THIS AGREEMENT, Made and entered into this 20^{+1} day of 4000 1998, by and between the County of Ravalli, a political subdivision of the State of Montana, and the Town of Darby, a municipal corporation,

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Town and County are desirous of entering into a contract whereby library services will be provided for all of the residents of the District from a central facility located within the Town and operated by the joint effort and authority of both parties; and said District; the school district is named for boundary purposes only, and the exterior boundaries of the Library District shall coincide with the exterior boundaries of the named school district; and

WHEREAS, the creation of a District will better serve the needs and convenience of the residents of the District and allow fair allocation of the tax burden among those using the library services;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. <u>BOARD OF TRUSTEES</u>, There is hereby established a joint town-county library, to be known as the Darby Community Public Library, the principal building and facilities for which shall be located within the Town of Darby. The operation of the Library shall be governed by a Board of Trustees who shall be appointed and hold office in the manner and for the terms described: The Town Council shall appoint two members, both of whom must be residents of the District, one of whom must be a Town resident, one of whom shall serve a term of one year, and the other shall serve a term of four years; the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint two residents of the District, one of whom shall serve a term of two years, and one of whom shall serve a term of three years; the Board of County commissioners and the Town Council shall jointly appoint a fifth member, who shall serve a term of five years; thereafter, each person appointed shall serve a term of five years, and the vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment by the Town Council or the Board of County Commissioners, or both, depending upon which of these bodies appointed the original Trustee for that particular term.

The Library Board shall consist of said five trustees. No member of either governing body shall be a member of such board.

2. <u>TERM AND SALARY OF BOARD</u>. Vacancies on the Board of Trustees for an unexpired term shall be filed as soon as possible in the manner in which the members of the Board are regularly chosen. Trustees shall not receive a salary or other compensation for services as Trustee, but necessary expenses actually incurred shall be paid by the Library Fund. A library trustee may be removed only by vote of the Town Council or the Board of County Commissioners or both, depending upon which of these bodies appointed the original trustee for that particular term. The Trustees shall serve no more than two full terms in succession.

3. <u>POWERS OF BOARD</u>. The Board of Trustees shall have the powers and duties set forth in MCA 22-1-309, as the same may be amended from time to time, or its successor provision, which by this reference is incorporated herein.

The Board shall select one of its members as chairperson and such other officers as they may deem necessary, for one-year terms.

4. <u>FINANCING THE LIBRARY</u>. The Board of Trustees shall submit its budget proposal to the Town Council and the Board of County Commissioners in sufficient time for each to include the recommendations in their annual budget considerations.

Estimated costs of services: The estimated costs of services will be \$25,300 annually. This will be obtained by a District-wide levy in excess of the Countywide levy; the sum of the district levy and county levy will not exceed 5 mils. Additional services may be provided through grants and other non-mil levied sources.

The financing of the district shall be from the following sources:

1)	A mil levy within the district	\$22,500
2)	From grants, gifts and other non-mil sources	2,800

The anticipated expenses of the District are as follows:

1)	Operation and maintenance of the District	\$17,300

2) Book purchases and capital expenditures 8,000

The Library shall be supported by a library tax on all of the property within the District, consistent with MCA 7-11-1112 and MCA 22-1-304.

The Town of Darby shall have custody of the funds of the Darby Community Public Library, and the Treasurer of Ravalli County shall transfer quarterly to the Town all monies collected for the Darby Community Library District.

- 5. <u>OWNERSHIP AND DISPOSITION OF PROPERTY</u>: The property of the District, which consists exclusively of personal property, will be held by, and in the name of the district. The Town of Darby shall provide adequate space adjacent to the Town Hall under a lease agreement with the Library District and the space shall be provided without cost to the District, but the district shall pay its share of repair and maintenance, heat, power, and other utilities for the space provided.
- 6. <u>DURATION</u>. The duration of this agreement shall be perpetual. The Agreement may be terminated by mutual consent accomplished by notice of termination in writing, delivered between the parties and effective after a ninety-day period.
- 7. <u>CONDITION FOR EFFECT</u>. This agreement shall become effective upon adoption and approval of the Multijurisdictional Service District as provided in MCA 7-1-1101 and 7-11-1112.
