Finalized library stipend payments for attendance at the Trustee workshops.

Began planning for the Gates Staying Connected Grant program training component.

Provided technical support for OCLC FirstSearch training in Helena.

LDD Goal 2: To improve library services to citizens by establishing an adequate and stable taxing district.

Provided support for public library district law changes currently being considered by the Montana Legislature.

Consulted with Montana's first library organized under public library district law.

LDD Goal 3: To ensure that all Montana citizens have access to quality library services.

Finalized details on Library Board Education Program and selected trainer for the program workshop.

Began application process for volunteer trainers for Library Board Education Program workshop.

Continued to monitor the PEEL scholarship recipients and to work with the PEEL Advisory Committee to begin the application process for the second round of scholarship awards.

Finalized the PEEL library stipend application form.

Approved 16 continuing education programs for credit; issued 10 OPI renewal certificates; awarded 3 certificates as part of the Montana Library Certification Program; issued 31 letters to program participants with enrollments or certificates expiring in 2005.

Participated in planning for MLA Legislative Library Day at the Montana State Library.

Provided support for library federation law changes currently being considered by the Montana Legislature.

LDD Goal 4: Montana citizens will understand, value, and use the services of Montana's libraries.

Completed the IMLS-required annual State Program Report for Montana's 2003 LSTA grant award.

LDD Goal 5: Montana citizens have easy and complete access to the information that they need at their libraries.

Began preparation of the 2004 Collection Management Honor Roll with receipt and review of updated collection management policies from 27 libraries.
