Proposed administrative rules revision clarify what the intent of the library budget standard and amend the reference to tribal college libraries to match the language found in Montana Code Annotated.

Taking into consideration the public comments the Commission has reviewed, the Commission will decide to either adopt the rules as amended below in red, to make additional changes to the rules based on the comments, or to adopt the rules as originally proposed on <u>October 11</u>.

10.102.1158 LIBRARY BOARD, GOVERNANCE, AND WORKING WITH THE DIRECTOR

(1) "PA public library"—is a public library defined at <u>22-1-301(3)</u>, MCA means those libraries as defined in <u>22-1-303</u> through <u>22-1-317</u>, MCA, and in Title 7, MCA, or <u>an accredited tribal</u> <u>college library that provides services to the public</u>; all libraries must comply with the standards set forth in ARM 10.102.1158-10.102.1162.

(2) The <u>public library</u> board <u>shall</u> meets at least six times a year and complyies with Montana's open meeting laws when meeting.

(3) The public Library Bboard members shall learn about the services the library provides to users, the role of the board in providing administrative and financial oversight, and the role of the board in planning for new services for users.

(4) The <u>public library</u> board <u>shall</u> receives at least three hours of continuing education each year.



(5) The <u>public library</u> board <u>shall</u> understands the revenue sources that fund the library, the budgeting process, and <u>shall</u> adopts an <u>annual</u> budget for the library.

(6) For a <u>public</u> library <u>defined at 22-1-301(3)</u>, created under Title 7 or Title 22, MCA, at least 70% of the revenue <u>is shall be derived</u> from local tax revenues. Grants, donations, and other revenue sources supplement but do not supplant local tax support. If <u>For an tribal</u> <u>accredited tribal</u> college library that serves tribal members, the tribal council <u>shall</u> recognizes and supports the efforts of the library to obtain funding.

(7) The library budget shows year-to-year growth reflecting community needs. The director and library board routinely present the library to the community and local government in a manner to maintain and increase the library's ability to meet their community's needs. <u>Public</u> <u>library boards and directors will shall identify the requisite financial resources necessary to</u> <u>provide adequate library services pursuant to the library's mission and will regularly</u> <u>communicate with community and local government leaders about financial needs and ability to meet community needs.</u>

(8) The <u>public library</u> board <u>in consultation with</u> and director, identify in writing what they want to accomplish in the next three to five years, and that plan is focused on meeting community <u>needs</u>.-The board and director annually review their plan and progress made.

(9) The <u>public library</u> board <u>shall</u> adopts emergency response plans that ensure the safety of the public and staff as the primary priority.

(10) The director or designee <u>shall</u> submite the Montana Public Library Annual Statistical Report to the Montana State Library. The board and director <u>shall</u> annually review public library statistics.

(11) The <u>public library</u> board <u>shall</u> adopts and regularly reviews policies that reflect the mission, <u>objectives</u> and goals of the library. The policies govern use of the library, its materials, and services. No single policy <u>may exist goes</u> more than four years without review.

(12) The <u>public library</u> board and director <u>shall</u> <u>review</u> <u>be familiar with</u> the most current Public Library Standards Road Map maintained by the Montana State Library.
