At the recent meeting of the Montana State Library Association in Helena it was decided to issue a bulletin every second month, with the cooperating libraries each sponsoring an issue. This first issue comes from the Missoula Public Library and the Missoula County Free Library.

New officers of the Association for the year 1939-1940 are: President - Margaret Fulmer, Parmly Billings Memorial Library, Billings; Vice-President - Bessie Sestak, Great Falls Public Library; Secretary - Doris Wilson, Montana State College Library, Bozeman; and Treasurer - Lucille Grove, Kalispell Public Library.

The meeting in Helena was well attended, and all in attendance report a pleasant and profitable time. It was decided by vote of the membership to hold the 1940 meeting in Billings.

The Association needs more members and larger representation from the smaller libraries if it is to serve Montana to the best advantage.

Of the three "library bills" introduced at the last session of the Legislature, one became law, that permitting two or more counties to join in establishing and supporting a central library, or contracting for countywide service from an existing library. The purpose of this law is to provide a way for counties of low valuation to have adequate library service. With the maximum support for a county library limited to one mill many counties can not adequately support a county library, while two or more acting together could provide countywide service for themselves. Such a regional library if established need not abolish any existing library or curtail its activities. Rather it should supplement the service already existing. Would your county benefit by such a regional library?

Ultimately, your legislator helps to determine the quality of life in Montana. It's an important job!







### Role of MSL

#### What We Can Do

- Work with stakeholders, the Commission, and the Governor's office to identify and propose funding and legislative needs
- Support legislation that has been approved by the Governor's office
- Provide information about legislation that impacts libraries or MSL
- Provide data and information to answer questions related to legislation

### What We Can't Do

- Support budget requests or legislation that hasn't been approved by the Governor's office
- Take positions on legislation that are outside the scope of MSL's authority




