Elvis's music still is heard all over the world, and he has been claimed to be seen. Elvis really started a new era back in the 50's.

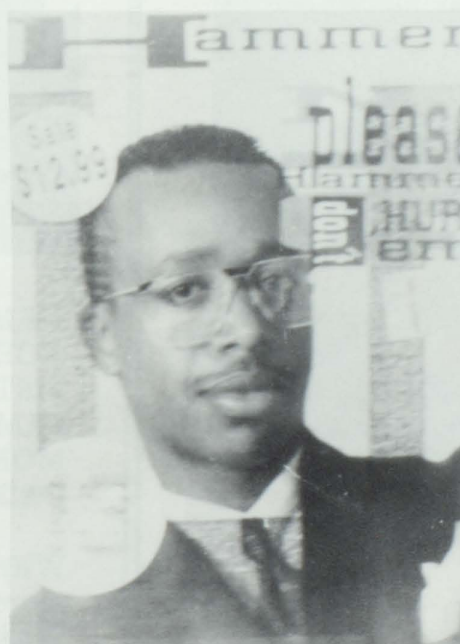


Gulf Crisis:

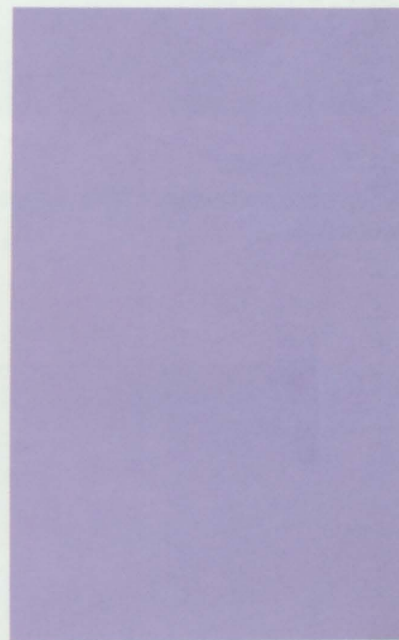

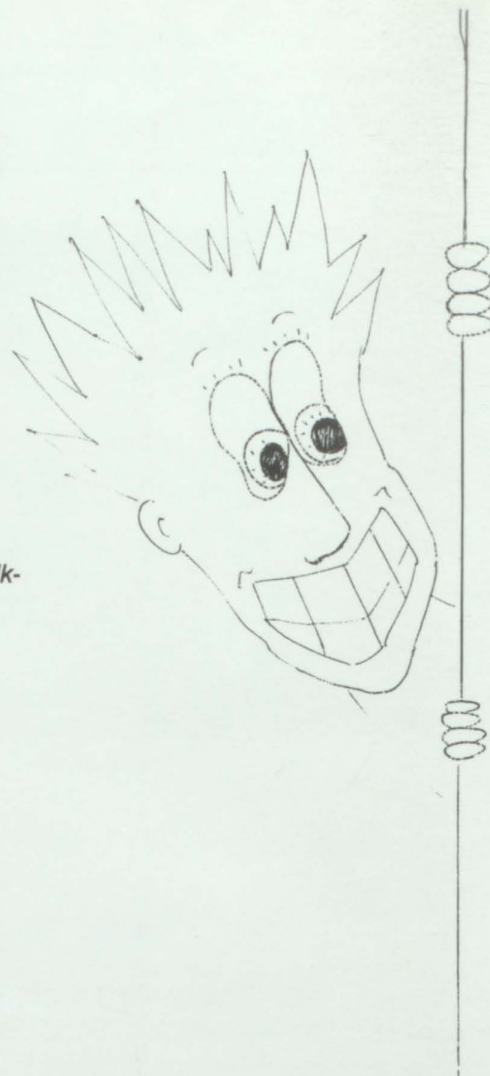

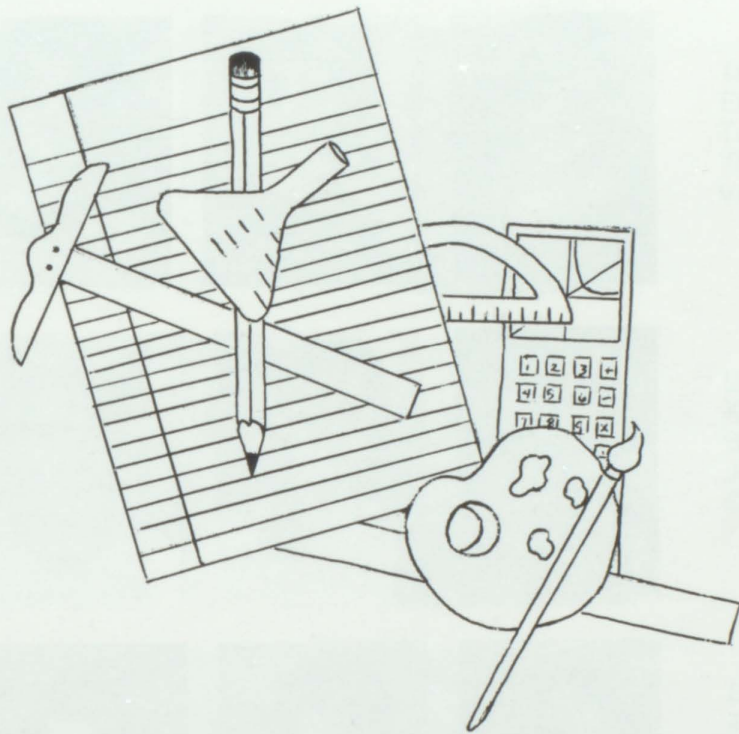

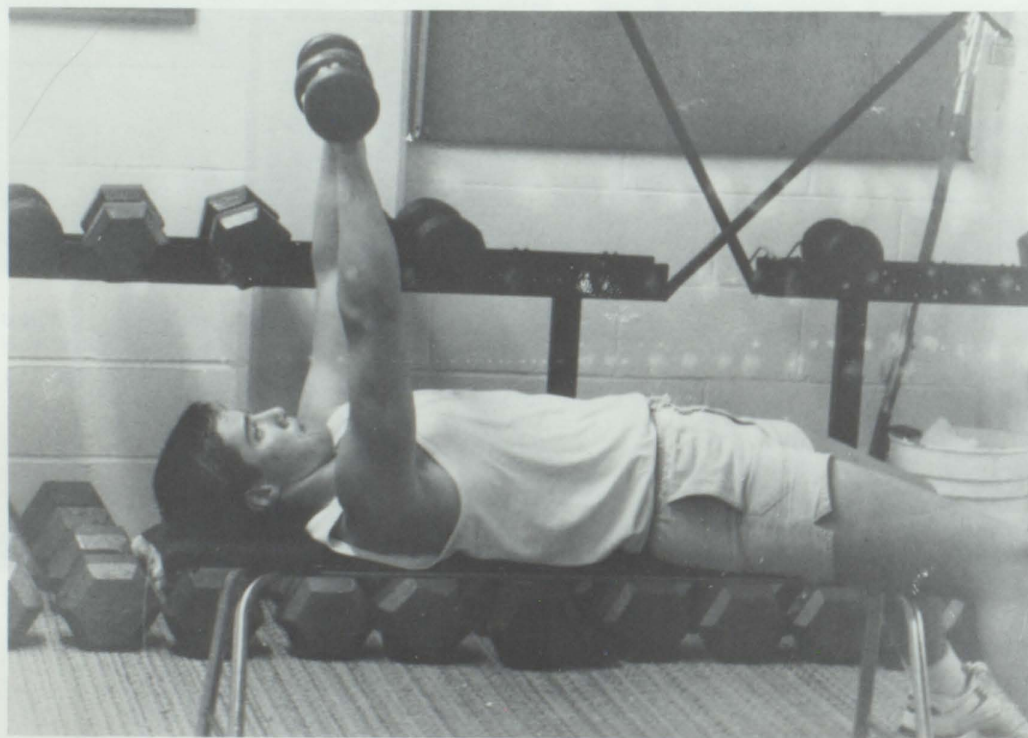

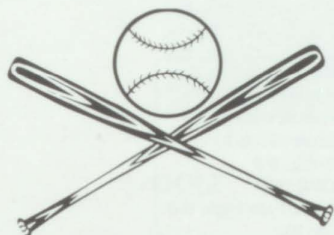

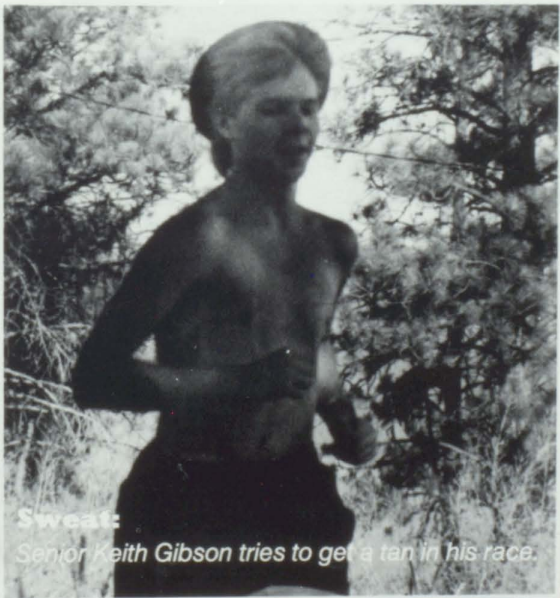
